TRR Historical Significance

- TRR is located 4 miles inside the western gateway to RMNP and 8 miles from historic Grand Lake Village.
- Homesteaded in 1914, TRR is also known as the Betty Dick Property, owner from 1962 to 2006.
- Trail River Ranch (TRR) is located at the confluence of the Bowen and Baker creeks and the Colorado River.
- The Buckaroo Barn, built in 1942, is one of the most photographed barns in the US.
- The continental trail passes through TRR.
- It is one of the few remaining homesteaded properties on the west side of RMNP.
